Keynote Speaker

Frank Lavin

U.S. and the World – Embracing the Challenges with Confidence

- Frank Lavin is a seasoned expert in global affairs, international trade, and political strategy. Frank served on the National Security Council staff, as White House Political Director, then as the U.S. Ambassador to Singapore and later as Under Secretary for International Trade at the U.S. Department of Commerce, where he led trade policy initiatives and business development strategies worldwide.

In addition to his government service, Frank has held leadership roles in global banking and corporate strategy, advising businesses on navigating complex international markets. His insights on political risk, economic trends, and U.S. foreign policy make him a sought-after speaker for conferences, corporate events, and leadership forums.

Known for his lighthearted and engaging style, Frank delivers sharp analysis with a touch of humor, making even complex topics accessible and thought-provoking. Whether discussing the latest global developments, U.S. politics, or economic shifts, he provides audiences with actionable takeaways and a clearer understanding of what lies ahead.

Community bank benchmarks will help you measure your program’s success and opportunities.

Navigating AI and the Deepfake Challenges in Community Banking

Cal Roberson, Integris, San Angelo, Texas

- This session will explore the growing threat of AI-driven risks, with a focus on deepfakes, which are becoming increasingly prevalent as AI technology advances. Deepfakes have been used to deceive everyone from top executives to bank staff. Real-world examples, prevention strategies, and compliance concerns will be addressed.

- Jeff Schmid has been president of the Kansas City Fed since 2023 and this year is a voting member on the Federal Open Market Committee. He will provide an economic outlook and share remarks based on his nearly four decades of banking and banking supervision.



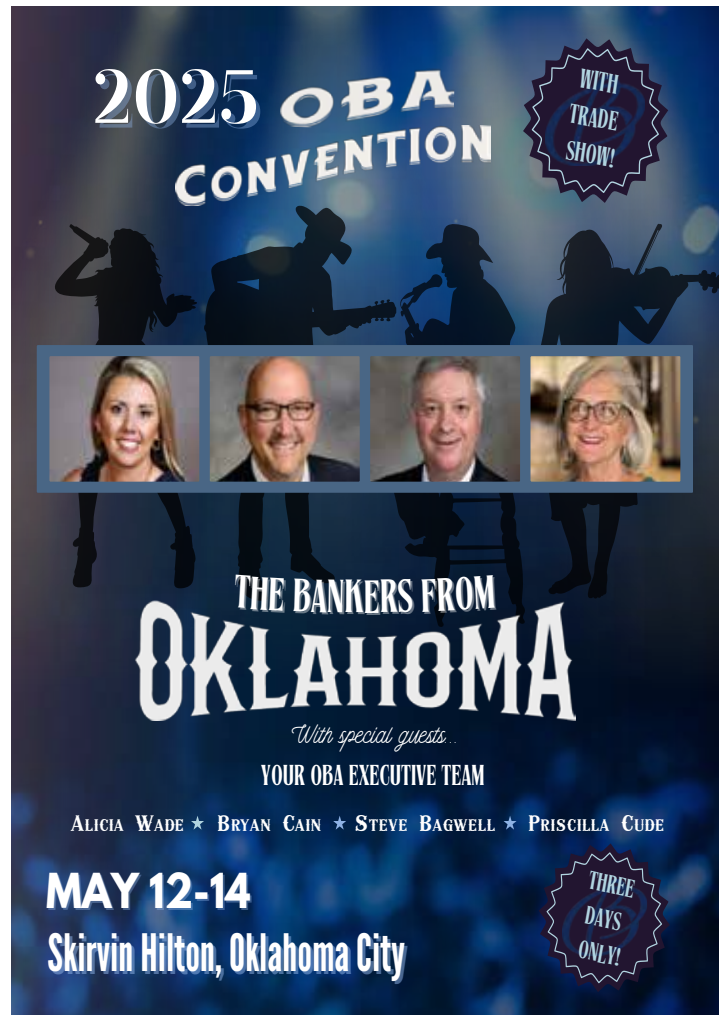
